In sharing their feelings about the OCC, our members try to describe something elusive and intangible. Though it has no physical clubhouse, it is the "home port" for all of us who have sailed long distances across big oceans.

Our membership as a whole has more experience offshore than any other sailing organisation and our members are passionate about sharing it with like-minded people.

By drawing on the experiences of all of our members and sharing the lessons they have learned, we have built a body of knowledge that will help future generations of offshore sailors.

Don't Delay, Join Today

The Ocean Cruising Club has two types of membership:

Full Membership - A Full Member of the OCC must have completed a non-stop ocean passage between two ports, where the distance between the ports is not less than 1000 nautical miles measured by the shortest practical Great Circle route, as skipper or active member of the crew in a vessel of not more than 70ft (21.3 m) LOA. The membership application can be completed online at http://oceancruisingclub.org/Join-Online.

Associate Membership - An Associate Member must have made a clear commitment to achieve the qualifying passage in a realistic and reasonable time-scale. The time allowed is at the discretion of the General Committee but is normally not more than three years.
